Executive Summary

Orange County Public Schools is the ninth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

DEERWOOD ELEMENTARY serves 479 students enrolled in #N/A grades. The student population's ethnicity is made up of 34% Hispanic and 66% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 81% White, 11% Black, 0% Native, 3% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 2% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Melanie May and Assistant Principal Natalie Shepherd. DEERWOOD ELEMENTARY is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include KKids, Chess Club, Battle of the Books.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at DEERWOOD ELEMENTARY indicates that the average age of the collection is #N/A and the number of books per student is #N/A. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for a highly effective media center that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, DEERWOOD ELEMENTARY does meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- We have a diverse collection of Hispanic books as well as a diverse collection of SEL titles.
- The age of our collection is better than the district average but is of concern and will be considered as we purchase new resources in each area of the library.
- There are 1117 audio, ebooks, and digital magazines available in SORA.
- There are over 80,000 digital audiobooks available for our students through Learning Ally.
